

The 3 B's

The 3 B's are very important to us in year 7 and every day you will be asked to show how you are demonstrating them.

BE READY - You need to be organised when you are at school, making sure you are ready to learn. You must have all of the equipment needed for the lesson especially your **3P's**, **PEN**, **PENCIL** and **PLANNER!**

What other equipment do you think you will need at Secondary School? THINK about all of your lessons!!!!!
BE RESPECTFUL - At the Archbishop Lanfranc Academy we expect you to be polite and respectful to all. This means you follow instructions when asked and are nice to your friends and classmates.
What could you do to show respect to the teachers and pupils?
BE SAFE - When moving around the building you must be SAFE , you must walk on the LEFT and there is NO running in the corridors. We also expect you to play with your friends sensibly at break and lunch time.
Apart from walking on the left, how else can you be safe at school?

If you follow these 3 B's you will be given Achievement Points which will go towards your House Total.

Curriculum

You will study a number of subjects in Year 7, all taught by subject specialists in specialist areas of the Academy:

English

Improve your reading and writing skills and develop a greater enjoyment of different kinds of texts.

Maths

Develop your numeracy skills and develop problem-solving skills using mathematical calculations.

Science

Explore the way the world works through scientific experiments and learn the key principles of biology, chemistry and physics.

Languages

Develop your speaking, reading and writing of either French or Spanish.

Computing

Learn the basics of how computers work and develop coding skills.

Humanities

Explore how humans have shaped the history and geography of the world we live in.

RE

Learn more about the world's major religions and explore how to develop ethical thinking to solve moral issues.

Technology

Develop your skills of planning and making nutritious meals, and of making objects using textiles.

PE

Keep fit and healthy whilst taking part in a number of sports and learn about adopting healthy lifestyles.

<u>PSHE</u>

Learn more about how to keep healthy, happy and secure both at school and in society; learn more about how society works and how to be a good citizen.

Behaviour System

Reward & Achievement

We like to reward our Year 7 students by giving them lots of positive praise and Achievement Points, you will receive achievement points throughout the day for demonstrating the Academy's key values. All of your achievement points are counted up weekly and rewards are given to students who have improved and continue to excel at the Academy. Every week students are awarded with a tutor award, every 6 weeks students are awarded with an ACO award and the DOL award is presented termly.

Poor Behaviour & Sanctions

We have a simple but effective behaviour policy. During lessons any misbehaviour in class will be met with a warning from the teacher. Once you have been given a warning if misconduct continues you will be moved to another seat within the class and if you continue with the poor behaviour you will be removed from the lesson. A behaviour point will be issued and you will have a class teacher detention (CTD); these detentions usually take place after school.

Accelerated Reader / Form Reader

Archbishop Lanfranc is a reading academy. You will have the opportunity to read daily. This will be done throughout the day, during tutor time and lessons. You will be given the chance to select your first book based on the accelerated reader program. Accelerated reader is our reading system that monitors your progress for your reading age. When you join the academy, you will have a quiz electronically to see where you are in your reading ability. From here, every time you finish a book you will go to quiz again and, depending on how you do, you could win Reader of the Term.
